The month of June has been designated 'Bible Month' by the Leaders of Worship and Preachers Trust. It gives a good opportunity to focus in more detail on one book of the Bible. This year the book of Ruth has been selected. In our troubled times, this story from over three thousand years ago, before the Jewish tribes had adopted a monarchy, has a lot of food for reflection. We hear in it about famine, about many people dying, about migration, about making hard choices, about unconventional relationships where love is deeply present or grows, about sharing and generosity under God, about extended family ties, about conversion, about the use of land, about the rebirth of hope in the next generation. What isn't to be found in the book of Ruth!?
