Circuit gains a Deacon The Leicester Trinity Methodist Circuit will be enriched from 1st September by the presence of a deacon within the staff team: Deacon Sharon Dilley from the Aire and Calder Circuit.

'A deacon's role focusses on bridging the gap between the church and the world'. Sharon's role will involve two projects -

1.Working with three village church congregations (Cosby, Countesthorpe and Blaby) to identify and implement strategies to build community links and develop the outreach of these churches.

2.Working with a small group to initiate a new project in Belgrave, establishing a new community of witnessing, serving, worshipping people.
