#### NOTICES FOR PASSION AND EASTERTIDE 9th-12th APRIL 2020

Dear Members and Adherents of Bishop Street Methodist Church,

We are living in extraordinary times. Those who have come to the UK as migrants usually have more experience of the fragility and precariousness of life compared to those of us from middle class European backgrounds. We have all had nearly a month of social-distancing and self-isolating, but it has started to reach the point that most of us now know of someone who has been stricken with Covid-19 and who may have died - May they rest in peace and rise in glory -

The events of the Last Supper, the crucifixion, and the resurrection in the life of Jesus Christ are very illuminating for us as we face this global challenge, which is challenging for every single household in different ways. Those events, if we can follow them in our devotions over the next few days, remind us that even God, in the person of Jesus, wasn't spared the worst kind of suffering and torment that life can present us with. Jesus knew what it was like to be abandoned by nearly all his friends and to physically suffer before dying. I say "nearly all", because it's recorded that his mother, the beloved disciple, and other women are believed to have stayed with him till he died. And yet, that wasn't the end. In chapter 28 of Matthew's Gospel, we hear that two of the Marys encountered an angel of some kind at the empty tomb telling them: "He has risen, as he said he would". Then the angel gave a further instruction: "Don't be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me." In other words: Resume your ordinary tasks (as best you can); continue doing what Jesus asks us to do to bring in the Kingdom of God, and we can be aware of Christ's presence woven throughout all we do and are.

So, take heart, and as Churches Together in Britain and Ireland asks of us, sing from your front doorsteps on Easter morning at 10am:

Christ the Lord is risen today; Alleluia! and, Thine be the glory, risen conquering son.
