Dear Kindred Disciples of Christ,

1943 marked the official start of the Methodist Homes (MHA) journey, although the seeds had been germinating for some time. The Rev. Walter Hall was a Methodist Minister with a concern for those retired people without family or property and who were often, in effect, one piece of bad luck away from the workhouse. His vision was that the Methodist Church should make some provision for these older people, and he argued his case unsuccessfully at the Methodist Conference for several years.

Fast forward to 2020 when there are more than 90 MHA care homes and over 60 retirement living schemes. What a wonderful Methodist success story it is, from its humble beginnings of a community of 12 women. MHA has grown to serve more than 18,500 older people. There has also been a great diversification in the type of services offered, including specialist dementia care, such as at Foxton Grange on Gipsy Lane here in Leicester, and live-at-home schemes. MHA is now the largest charity care provider in the UK with 7,500 employees. It has received independent awards for its end-of-life care, its extensive network of 4,000 volunteers, its pioneering chaplaincy and music therapy provision.

The other MHA home in Leicester, Aigburth at Oadby has managed to cope with some Covid 19 cases without these infecting others at the home. It is in need of volunteer support even at this time of lockdown, especially with telephone-based pastoral care and preparation of worship resources. Please be in touch with Aigburth's volunteer coordinator if you could offer an hour or two. Also, do remember Leicester's MHA care homes in your prayers – see page two of the Circuit Prayer Diary.

This Sunday at 3pm there is a live service to mark MHA Sunday. It can also be watched after the event. Prof Clive Marsh makes a short contribution at the end of the service. He says, "It sounds as if it will be a powerful event due to the many people contributing and the range and intensity of the experiences being reported and reflected on within the service."
