Dear Kindred Disciples of Christ,

The Methodist Church has an article on re-opening churches from Jude Levermore, the Head of Mission, who writes of her hopes for how the Church will move forward, by being 'the pilgrim people of the moment':

"As we begin to think about 'going back into our buildings' I am hopeful that we will take time to consider what we have learned from being out of them. I am hopeful that we will have solidified our understanding that church is not a building- we teach that to our children, but do we hold that in our hearts? We, the people are the church, the body of Christ meeting together in community, acting together in mission, longing together for the transformation of our world, responding together to our calling.

I'm praying that as we share a road map for leaving lockdown, with all its needful risk assessments and procedures, we will guard against entering another lockdown, that of being so caught up in our buildings that we miss the opportunities to be church without them.

First undertake a spiritual assessment; to what is God calling this church, this chapel? I believe the Spirit might be asking us to be brave, to not cling to the old but to be the pilgrim people of the moment. Let's be a people of vision, let's not long to get back to normal, let's see what God might do if we allow ourselves to be led somewhere new." These are inspiring thoughts, and they support the Leicester Trinity Methodist Circuit's concern that a return into our buildings should not be done in a hurry.

Recent news from the Government and from the Methodist Church on reopening churches (whether for private prayer or for a worship service) involves at least a team of four people per church (who are not in the four 'at-risk' categories). These roles are: a Covid-19 Responsible Person; a Steward at the door who registers people as they arrive; a Steward introducing the service, as usually happens; and someone who is mindfully aware of people's pastoral needs, and whether there is anything which needs following up. A cleaning team is also needed. Bishop Street Methodist Church also needs the risk assessment to take account of the Chapel Cafe, rental groups, and individuals entering the building, all of whom will need to list their name and contact details for the sake of 'tracking and tracing'.

A deep clean is currently being required before and after each event, which basically involves a thorough clean of all frequently touched surfaces. Reducing people's contact with surfaces and objects is better than relying on cleaning once contact has taken place. The risk assessment therefore involves thinking about how a church (or other premises) can limit the movement of people as far as possible and reduce people's need to touch surfaces or objects. airing the building before and after events is also essential.

At the moment the risk assessment, procedures, and volunteers needed for reopening are rather daunting. As time progresses, if the virus recedes, these demands may lessen. What we're being encouraged to consider in the face of these demands is: what has been learned about Church and about being people of God during the past 3 months? What is God asking us to take forward from these experiences, rather than simply trying to resume things as they were before (which isn't really possible at the moment.) Let's share together our thoughts and insights on these questions. Rev'd Fran Rhys
