Here is some news from Leicester City of Sanctuary After 3 months of lockdown in Leicester, we have finally been able to return to some face-to-face activities ... and it feels so good!

Leicester Unitarians have made this possible by offering us the use of the Great Chapel Garden on Tuesdays as a safe outdoor space for our work. Over past 2 weeks we have been focusing on the distribution of toiletries, PPE and cleaning products in the chapel garden. An appointment system is in place to avoid overcrowding, and, to keep everyone safe, all those visiting the garden are requested to wear face coverings, which are provided on entry.

It's not the drop-in, but it's a way of providing something useful to our people whilst giving us all the opportunity to see each other again.

That's just as important, if not more so, than the toiletries and other goods given away. At the drop-in, we always had various activities and visits from partners that people could benefit from. With the restrictions on group size and social distancing, that's been a challenge in the garden, but last week we came up with an interesting solution...

Ride and Stride Day Saturday 12th September 2020

The annual Ride and Stride day is taking place again this year in spite of the impact of Covid-19.

This is an event which raises money for the Leicestershire Historic Churches Trust. The money is raised through sponsoring either riders or striders who visit churches and chapels in the city and county. Half of the money raised goes back to the church nominated by the participating person and half into the general Historic Churches fund. Last year Tanvi Pate raised funds by walking to city centre churches. In the past we have benefited from grants from the Historic Churches funds. It is a very worthy event and cause to support.
