Bible Month - June 2021

The Gospel of Mark is the focus for Bible Month this June, so that all preachers on Sundays will preach on Mark, using the helpful material specially prepared for this purpose. It's an initiative of the Methodist Church and the Leaders of Worship and Preachers Trust to focus every June on one particular book of the Bible. It's a useful way for the church community to deepen understanding of scripture and the commitment to sharing ideas and experience of that with others. There are some pocket-sized Mark's Gospel at church. Please help yourself to one and take one to give to someone else.

Author of the '30 days with Mark' booklet, Keith Brower writes that we need to understand that Jesus' ministry is conducted in an occupied land, subdued and pacified by the Romans, probably just before the Roman destruction of the temple in Jerusalem in AD70. That destruction was in response to a large-scale Jewish rebellion. Trying to get on as best they can with their everyday lives, many Jews longed for the day when God would, once again, dwell in the midst of them. There's a consensus among scholars that the Gospel was written for a community in Rome but was read more widely around the Mediterranean area by followers of Christ, often at risk from different levels of persecution. Mark, its author, is a committed believer who thinks that the accounts of Jesus' life actually happened in Galilee and Judea – this is no pious fiction. So, get reading the Gospel (it's only 20 pages) and get ready to enjoy Bible Month and Mark's Gospel afresh!

Bible Study will resume in the chapel on **Thursdays 12 to 1pm from 3rd June.** All are welcome to come and discuss the end of Matthew's Gospel, followed by the start of

Mark's Gospel in subsequent weeks. There will be plenty of space and air between the participants.

The Chapel Cafe will reopen on Tuesday 1st June between 10am - 4pm. Come and support the cafe, where masks are needed, until you are seated at a table. Tableservice will be provided. Groups of up to six can gather at a table - or two households of any size.

Mid-week worship will resume on Wednesday 9th June between 1-1.30pm. The service will be led by Rev. Fran Rhys.
