Joshua (and Me) I (Revd Derek McLean) recommend going to see this show at Curve on the 4th and 5th November. “Based on Rachel Hammond’s own life, alongside stories from other siblings of individuals with additional needs, Joshua (and Me) provides permission and space for siblings to honestly and openly explore their experiences, too.”

Benevolence Fund. Most Methodist churches have a Benevolence Fund. This is money which is used to help anyone linked to the church who is in urgent financial need. An application for support goes to the Minister and is considered by a small group to see if it is thought a suitable request. Over the years this money has supported asylum seekers in their claims for asylum and supported others with unexpected expenses. Regular gifts are welcome at any time. However, it has been our practice to take up an extra offering at the end of the Communion service as well as an earlier regular collection for church funds. Any small gift will be welcome at the monthly Communion services.

Weekly Offerings At the end of financial year on 31st August the total Weekly Offerings for 2021-22 were £2,306 down on budget. Even if we maintain these at the 2021-22 level our projected total budget deficit for the current year will be £8,750. Please check that your giving to the church is up to date and consider making a small increase if possible. We have now restarted taking a collection as part of our Sunday Morning Service.
