**MINISTERIAL SABBATICAL** (A period set aside every seven years, for a minister to have a 3 month break from their normal duties):

Liam's sabbatical has now begun, running until the end of August. He will be using his sabbatical to rest and reconnect with his family. This is the reason he has chosen to take his sabbatical over the summer (to coincide with the school holidays). The sabbatical will also provide Liam with greater time to read and write as he explores the role of doubt as a positive aspect of faith. His research will hopefully lead to the creation of devotional/worship resources.

**EXHIBITION OPENS:** On Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> the Exhibition of Alan Caine's paintings was opened. Richard Gill gave a short talk on Alan and his approach to painting. The exhibition, entitled 'Patterns Engraved into the Earth' will be open until Saturday June 24<sup>th</sup>

**JUNE IS BIBLE MONTH** In the last few years Bishop Street has been part of the Methodist Church's Bible Month initiative; a chance to engage more deeply with a specific book of the Bible.

Bible Month has tackled both shorter books such as Ruth, Jonah and the

Letter to the Colossians and longer books such as Isaiah and the Gospel of St Mark. This year the focus is on the Book of Revelation, the final book in the Bible. Revelation is a visionary book full of complex imagery and dramatic events (as well as more familiar types of Biblical writing such as letters and hymns). The other name for Revelation is the Apocalypse, which means the uncovering or disclosure of something hidden and through the centuries people have tried to understand what the book means in relation to their own spiritual lives, the life of the Church and political, social and economic life and future of the world.
