Living with Contradictory Convictions - An Outcome

Our congregation is diverse is many ways, and we have been on a journey to better understand how we can continue together with contradictory convictions. We have worked hard to recognise the faith and integrity of those we disagree with while remaining in relationship as a worshipping community. This has demanded grace, patience, and love.

The basis of our worshipping community is our shared faith in Christ. As Methodist people, we work out our faith through our engagement with scripture, tradition, reason and experience. This approach affords a breadth to our understanding of matters of faith, which reinforces the need for grace and understanding as we care for one another.

Most recently, our Church Council has voted on the possibility of registering the church building for the solemnisation of same-sex marriages. The vote was passed by a clear majority, but we did not all agree. Nevertheless, we remain together and recognise that what holds us together (our faith in Christ) cannot be overcome by our lesser disagreements.

Our diversity, and the love that we share, stands as a prophetic witness in a world that is all too often divided. With people sadly pitted against one another, our faithful community lives as a demonstration of God's reconciling love.
