ANNUAL GIFT DAY: Sunday 20th July has been designated our Annual Gift Day. This is an opportunity to consider if we can make an additional donation to Church Funds, over and above our weekly giving, as our situations allow. Gift envelopes will be available on Sunday, or if you would like to make a bank transfer please see Martin Briers or Revd Liam Dacre-Davis for the details.

The Finance and Property team are also pleased to be able to report two pieces of good news: 1) The **Church heater**, which was deemed unusable early this year, has been repaired last week. An engineer with the relevant skill and knowledge was found, and he has been able to repair and certify it as safe to use. This gives us a better breathing space as we consider how to shift away from gas heating. 2) The **Circuit Meeting** has approved a grant over 3 years to support the work we do through Chris's post, with the community activities and self-help groups in the Church buildings.

This support will ease our financial situation from 2025-26, but in the meantime we are still facing a significant deficit in the current year. This is why the Gift Day is so important to this year's finances. Anything we can offer towards the ambitious target of £3,200 set in the budget for the year will be a huge help in meeting our Church's needs.

CIRCUIT WELCOME SERVICE: On Sunday August 31st there will not be a morning service at Bishop Street. Instead we will be joining with all the Churches of the Leicester Trinity Circuit for a service to welcome Revd Ian Hui as a new member of the staff team. The service will be held at 10.30am at Wigston Magna Methodist Church. This will be a great opportunity to meet up with a much wider range of Leicester Methodists. To ensure as many can attend as possible, we will be aiming to provide lifts for people without transport. If you would like a lift, or if
