WINTER NIGHT SHELTER, ONE ROOF LEICESTER: “Since we had to close the Winter Night Shelter in 2020 due to the Covid pandemic, we’ve been offering alternative winter accommodation each year to people who are rough sleeping. Sadly, with the rising number of people sleeping rough across the City and County, we have made the decision to reopen the shelter this winter.

This year, we will be running a static night shelter based in Charles St Baptist Church in the city centre. The shelter will open from 1st December 2025 to 31st March 2026. We’ll be welcoming up to 20 guests each night, providing a safe, warm space from 9pm to 8am, along with hot and cold refreshments.

We’re really excited to reopen the shelter and would be thrilled if you’d consider volunteering with us. If you have time free in the evening or overnight and would like to help our night shelter be a success we would love to hear from you. CHRISTMAS GIFT SUNDAY: On Advent Sunday, 30th November, we will be receiving items to give to people who may get very little this Christmas. We will be sharing via the Women's Refuge, One Roof Leicester, and After 18 (support for asylum seekers). The items generally needed include nice toiletries, Christmas goodies (biscuits, chocolates) and little festive items such as hats, scarves, fluffy socks, etc. Also education stationery packs which After18 give to students at school or college. Winter hats, scarves, gloves, socks and toiletries for young men are always appreciated.

Please bring unwrapped presents so they can be directed to appropriate people. Thanks for anything you can donate.

We will also have a 'Postbox' to share cards with other Church members, available from December, alongside an opportunity to send a 'collective card' to everyone at Church.

CHAPEL CAFÉ. The café is run by the Zinithya Trust and is open 10:00-16:00 Monday to Friday and 10:00-15:00 Saturdays, serving good quality affordable fair trade hot drinks, breakfast baps, soup, jacket potatoes, sandwiches, light snacks and delicious cakes.
